

FLIGHT TO THE FUTURE.

The Funerals, Sunday, of George Whitham and Henry Hoppman--Large Attendances.

WHITHAM.

The funeral of George W. Whitham, whose death occurred on Friday last, of heart disease, took place from his family residence Sunday afternoon at four o'clock. The ceremony was in charge of Washington lodge, No. 1, I O O F., of which he was an honored and esteemed member. Members of Harmonia and Excelsior lodges were also in attendance upon the ceremony, which was very impressive. The remains were encased in an elegant casket, on which lay a beautiful white wreath composed of lilies and other flowers, emblematic of the pure life which the departed had led on earth. The pall-bearers were T. Gresson, W. Wolberton, N. A. Gress, A. Stoermer, W. Mercer and Peter Gress. The remains were interred at the Aspen Grove cemetery, and were followed to the last resting place by a long concourse of friends. The usual burial rites of the Odd Fellows were performed at the grave.
