HELD FOR MRS. RYAN**

SOLEMN REQUIEM MASS

**Many Relatives and Friends
From Out of City Attend
Last Rites.**

Funeral services, beautiful and impressive in their significance were held at 9 a. m. today in the Immaculate Conception church over the body of Mrs. T. K. Ryan.

Solemn requiem high mass was celebrated with Rev. Monsignor J. P. Ryan of Davenport, a brother-in-law, the celebrant. Those who assisted were the Rev. John Carroll, deacon, the Rev. Father M. Kissane of North English sub-deacon, the Very Rev. J. J. Toomey, pastor of ceremonies. Dean Toomey preached an eloquent funeral sermon. Burial was made at Mt. Calvary, Kenwood.

Ellen Nolan was born in County Kerry, Ireland, May 26, 1849. She came to Davenport from Ireland in 1869. She was married to T. K. Ryan, October 28, 1873. Her husband preceded her in death four months to the day. In 1910 the family removed to Cedar Rapids.

Eight sons and daughters were born of the union of whom seven survive. Winifred died in 1900. The surviving sons and daughters are: James A., John T., Miss Monica and Joseph F., all living at home; Mrs. J. H. Wetrich and Mrs. J. H. Kelly, both of North English and Thomas E., 1709 Second avenue.
