Mrs. Billick, 73, Dies; Rites Set

Mrs. L. H. Billick, 73, of 903 Fifth street, Coralville, died Sunday afternoon at the home of her son-in-law and daughter, Dr. and Mrs. Robert Eilers, in Leavenworth, Kan. Ill for some time, she had been at the Eilers home for the past two months.

Requiem high mass will be at 9 a.m. Thursday at St. Patrick's church with burial to be in the new section of St. Joseph's cemetery.
