and repaired in 1822, at the cost of £757, and again in 1846-7, at the cost of £1042, so that it has now about 600 sittings. The burial ground was enlarged in 1848. The modern parts of the church are the south transept and a north aisle. The benefice is a *perpetual curacy*, now valued at £170, in the patronage of Mrs. Davies, and incumbency of the Rev. J. S. Davies, M.A. and F.S.A. It has an endowment of land worth about £37 a year. The *Parsonage*, given at the foundation of the church, is a small ancient house in Itchen village. The *National Schools*, on Peartree Green, were built in 1848-9, with a house for the teachers, at the cost of £865. 15s. 3d., upon common land given by the Bishop of Winchester, as lord of the manner of Bitterne. In 1857, an *Infant School* was built, at the cost of £600, raised by subscription, as a memorial of the late patron and incumbent, the Rev. Wm. Lewis Davies. TRINITY CHAPEL, at WESTON, in the southern part of the parish, was erected in 1855, at the sole expense of the Rev. Wm. Preston Hulton, M.A., of *Barnfield*, who also built the school. These structures cost about £700, and are liberally supported by him. PEARTREE GREEN is the only open part of what was formerly Ridgeway Heath, and there is still upon it a very ancient *pear tree* that has been split by lightning, but still bears fruit. Near it is an *Independent Chapel*, built in 1838, at the cost of about £1500. The Rev. Richd. Laishley is its minister. There is a Primitive Methodist Chapel at Weston, built in 1853. As noticed at page 163, this parish ought to receive yearly from *Mill's Charity*; £1. 16s. 4d. for the minister; £1. 16s. 4d. for the poor; 18s. 2d. towards the repairs of "Jesus Chapel," and a coat or gown for a poor man recommended by the minister.
