

Mrs. Anna F. Moylan, 98, One of Oldest Residents In City, Dies Thursday Night

One of Iowa City's oldest residents, Mrs. Anna F. Moylan, 98, died at 11 p. m. Thursday at the home of her daughter, Mrs. L. H. Billick, 420 South Clinton street. She had suffered a short illness.

Mry Moylan was a member of St. Patrick's church, a member of the Altar and Rosary society, and the oldest member of the St. Patrick's Parent-Teachers association.

She was born in Cedar county October 10, 1851, but had lived in Iowa City for the last 38 years.

Mrs. Moylan is survived by three daughters and three sons. They are: James of Iowa City, Frank, West Liberty, Ralph,
