James Manpin, Sr.

Nicholas Moore of Virginia born 1749

Ralph Morgan with Bowman's Expedition buried off Spencer Pike  
Montgomery County, Ky. near Morgan's Station

Thomas Mesley -Virginia 1759 lived in Montgomery Co.Ky. since 1794

John Moss born Prince William County, Va., 1762 Enlisted Loudon Co.Va.  
Buried near Camarags, Montgomery County.

Henry Myers d. 1824 buried at the McFarland Place, Antioch Road, Montgomery  
County, Ky.

Joseph Nickoll buried in Montgomery County, now Mergan County

John O'Rear buried on Old Isen Farm, Fogg Pike, Montgomery Co.,Ky.

William O'Rear made affidavitt as a fellow seldier of John O'Rear  
in Montgomery County, April 23, 1883 that he knew him  
in Prince William County, Virginia 1769 -1776.

Jesse Peake -Virginia born 1752

William Piles born Loudon Co., Va. 1756 served Virginia -lived in  
Montgomery County si nce 1798

John Fleak, his name was Fleakenstadter but shortened to Fleak.  
He was excused from levies in 1794 because of his infirmities.  
Had Fleak's Station not far from Mergan's Station.

Nathaniel Williams Ralls born Stafford County, Va. died in what is  
now Bath County, Ky.
