Description: In the nineteenth century and most of the twentieth century, naturalization was a three step process. First, one declared intention to naturalize, then petitioned for naturalization, and lastly, received a certificate or a court order granting citizenship. Please note that many immigrants never completed the full process. In the nineteenth century, many states allowed their residents to buy land, work, and vote without obtaining full citizenship. During the late 1920's through 1950's county level naturalizations phased out and the process was taken over by Federal Courts. These records do not include records found in An Index to Naturalization Records In pre-1907 Order Books of Indiana County Courts. With some exceptions, the documents indexed in this book are located within the county and books indicated. Saint Joseph County Naturalization documents date from 1856-1956, and were indexed from master index books. Be it Known, That on the 11th day of October A. D. 1880,
personally appeared in the Clerk's Office of the St. Joseph Circuit Court, before the Clerk thereof,
George Ejerski an Alien and reports himself for **NATURALIZATION**,
and being duly sworn on oath, declares that he is a Native of Germany
aged about 25 years, and owes allegiance to the Emperor of
Germany that he emigrated thence, embarked at Bremen
and arrived at Baltimore in the United States, on the 8
day of June A. D. 1871, and that it is bona-fide his intention to reside in and
become a citizen of the United States, and to renounce forever **All Allegiance and Fidelity** to every For-
eign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever, and particularly to the Emperor of
Germany
