She was born Cecelia Bush on June 30, 1862 in Somerset, Ohio, one of the 12 children of Mount and Maria Bush.

Enters Order in 1881

Sister Helena came to St. Mary's in 1879 as a student at St. Mary's Academy, and in 1881 entered the Sisters of the Holy Cross, receiving the habit in the same year. She made her profession of final vows in 1885.

From 1885 to 1921 she served in Ohio, Colorado, Utah, Michigan, Washington, D. C., Wisconsin, and California as well as Indiana. In this state she served in Logansport, LaPorte, Anderson and at St. Joseph's Academy and St. Mary's Academy, both in South Bend.

Serves as Postmaster

In 1921 she went to St. Mary's convent in South Bend where she had assignment, from 1923 to 1932, was postmaster of the St. Mary's branch of the Notre Dame Post Office.

A nephew and niece and several grandchildren and grandnieces survive.

The Requiem High Mass will be at 6 a. m. Monday in the Church of Our Lady of Loreto on the St. Mary's campus. Burial will be in Our Lady of Peace Cemetery on the campus.

Police Hunt For Suspect In Burglary

Police were unsuccessful in their attempt early today to apprehend a man who had apparently burglarized a home and then made off with the homeowner's auto.

Patrolman Richard A. Garis and Anthony A. Gish, reported that while they were on patrol early today they spotted a speeding auto at Michigan St. and Western Ave. and told the driver, whom they described as a Negro about 19 to 23, turn onto Western and pull over to the curb.

The driver did turn but accelerated away from the intersection, officers said. The speeder then turned right into a tire service store at 117 Western Ave., abandoned the auto and fled west on foot.

Officers said they lost the man, about 6-foot tall and weighing about 165 pounds, somewhere west of the parking lots near Western and Franklin streets.

Auto Discovered Later

The officers later discovered that the auto was being reported as stolen from Roy M. Wells, 60 of 438 W. Ford St.

Wells told police that the keys to the auto belonged to his wife. A check at his home indicated that someone had entered by an unlocked front door and removed his wife's purse from the living room.

Wells said the keys were in the purse along with papers and \$10 in currency. He estimated that the auto was taken between 10 p. m. and 2 a. m. today.

Wells and his wife were at home when the purse was taken.
