

**126 GRADUATES FROM IOWA CITY AREA HONORED**

**Dr. Charles B. Wilson Gives Charge to Class At Ceremony At Fieldhouse**

Eight hundred and seventy-eight bachelors and masters including 126 women and graduate students from Iowa City and vicinity and 71 commencement were conferred by President Eugene A. Gilmore before 1,000 persons in the University of Iowa 1935 annual June commencement exercises at the fieldhouse this evening.

Following the charge to the graduates by Prof. Charles Beachy Wilson of the Criminal Department, highest faculty member in point of seniority, the certificates for degrees and diplomas were presented to President Gilmore by the members of the faculty of the various colleges.

**Presented Diplomas**

Before the reading of degrees, Prof. J. B. Shambaugh, dean of the University, presented James C. Drake of Manchester, college of liberal arts; Robert Olson, Lansing college of law; J. Phillip MacCulloch, college of engineering; and Frank J. Ogden, college of agriculture, to President Gilmore as the representatives of the new 1935 graduates.

In his charge to the graduates, Professor Wilson asked the graduates not to consider their diploma as a passport to success, but to realize that "it is not only what you have done, but what you are doing and will do" that will count in the life of a man.

He pointed out the need for developing personality, with a view to which all careers are deemed. "The opportunist," he said, "may have of bitterness must be wiped out."

**"Never Be Sluggish"**

In conclusion he told the graduates to "never consider your education finished but always develop the power to learn and to grow."

"I hope it will be a long time before you are graduated, be an ever learning organism."

Three hundred and seven candidates received degrees of bachelors of arts, 137 bachelors of science, 61 bachelors of arts, 40 bachelors of science, 44 certificates in teaching, 20 certificates in education, 15 doctor of philosophy, 27 master of science and 20 doctor of dental science.

Women of degrees and certificates from Iowa City and vicinity by towns are as follows, with one admission: 15 after some evening graduation with distinction, two with honors, 175 high distinctions and three with distinction (\*\*\*) highest distinction.
